



UPCYCLE SHARK

Materials:

- Tissue paper
- School Glue (P.V.A)
- Scissors
- Empty Yogurt or noodle container
- Tape
- Black permanent pen



GREAT HAMMERHEAD

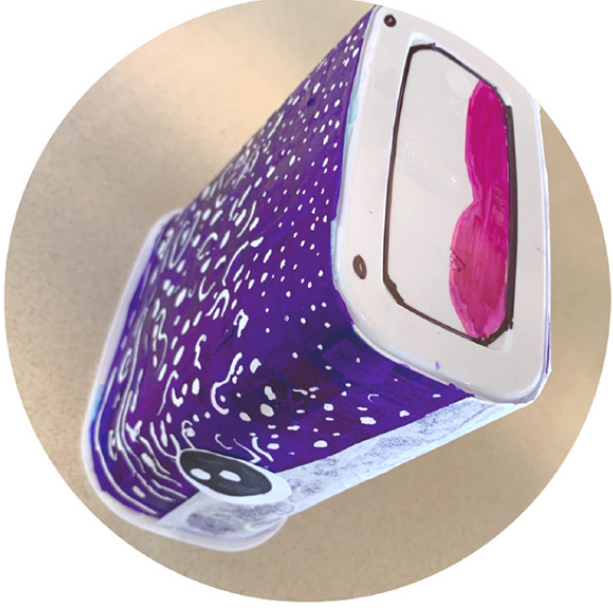
1. Cut sections from either side of a rectangular container. (ask a grown up for help). Then tape it onto a regular noodle container.
2. Apply glue thinly over the container and place on pieces of tissue paper, leaving the end white for a mouth. Now leave to dry.
3. Cut out 10 gill slits, 5 for each side and 2 large eyes from white paper. Colour the eyes black and leave two small white circles for cute cartoon eyes.
4. When the container is dry, stick on the gills and eyes.
5. Use a permanent marker to add a mouth, **nares** (nostrils) and remember the **Ampullae of Lorenzini** (electroreceptors) for your shark to be able to hunt down those tasty sting rays!



WHALE SHARK

A rectangular container can be used to create a huge wide open mouth perfect for filter feeding.

1. As before cover the container, use dark tissue paper on top and white on the underside for the **countershading**. (a sharks form of camouflage).
2. When dry, use a white corrector pen to add the markings of a whale shark. * Whale shark patterns are unique just like a humans finger print.
3. Now add some extra details to give your friend a super cute mouth.



NURSE SHARK

Try using some different materials too!

1. Using scissors cut out a mouth (ask a grown up for help with this part). Then cut out some **barbels** (used to find food) from white paper and stick them on the snout.
2. Add a thin layer of glue on the top of the container, then sprinkle sand or ground up oats to look like the **dermal denticles** (skin teeth) of a Nurse shark.
