TASSELLED WOBBERGONG (Eucrossorhinus dasygong)

- ▶ The Tasselled wobbergong can be found inshore and on coral reefs across northern Australia, Indonesia and Papua New Guinea
- ▶ The fringe of branching around its head, along with its complex color pattern of small blotches, enables it to camouflage well against reefs
- ▶ They are primarily nocturnal, with a small home range, often not traveling far

YOU KNOW?

The Tasselled wobbergong has a **DISTINCTIVE FRINGE** of branching dermal lobes around its head, which extends onto its chin like a beard

The Tasselled wobbergong **USES ITS TAIL AS A LURE**, waving it back and forth to draw its prey in close enough to strike
