FOUND IN INSHORE WATERS OFF SOUTHERN AND SOUTHEASTERN AUSTRALIA. CAN REACH AN AVERAGE LENGTH OF 59-71 INCHES (150-180 CM).

THEY ARE A PRIMARILY NOCTURNAL, BOTTOM DWELLING SHARK.

THEY USE THEIR CAMOUFLAGE TO HIDE FROM PREY, WAITING MOTION-LESS ON THE BOTTOM UNTIL SOMETHING TASTY SWIMS CLOSE. THEIR DERMAL LOBES (MUSTACHE) LURE PREY IN LIKE BAIT.

> THEY HAVE SPIRACLES (OPENINGS BEHIND THE EYE), WHICH SUPPLY OXYGEN DIRECTLY TO THE EYES AND BRAIN.
