



### WHERE DO THEY LIVE?

Grey reef sharks are found on coral reefs, including fringing reefs, and in atoll passes, lagoons, and near drop-offs in tropical waters in the Indian and Pacific ocean.

## GREY REEF SHARK

(*Garcharinus amblyrhynchos*)

- ▶ Diet: Small bony reef fishes, crustaceans, and cephalopods (octopus and squid)
- ▶ Size: 2.65 metres (8.69 ft)
- ▶ Reproduction : 1 to 6 pups per litter viviparous with a yolk-sac placenta

## DID YOU KNOW?

Grey reef sharks are social, aggregating during the day and then dispersing at night to hunt. They've been seen following the smaller whitetip reef sharks who can get into crevices in the reef and drive fish out.



CONSERVATION STATUS

Grey reef sharks are listed as **ENDANGERED** on the IUCN Red List
