PAPER PLATE MANTA RAY

Materials:

2 Paper plates 1 White paper Stapler Felt pen Scissors





- 1) Draw the Manta ray outline on base of 1st plate, then add *Cephalic fins* at the mouth opening. (These fins help push zooplankton into their mouths while filter feeding).
- 2) Now draw and colour in your Manta, include two eyes on each side of the mouth.
- 3) Cut out around the outline.
- 4) Place on top of the underside of your 2nd plate and draw around it leaving out the Cephalic fins.



- 5) Draw 5 *gill slits* each side of the body and give your Manta its own *Ventral spots*. (These are an individual's unique spot pattern often used to I.D different Manta ray)
- 6) Then cut out around the outline. Cut a thin tail from the offcuts.
- 7) Staple around the main part of the body leaving the mouth open.

Then staple around the Pectoral fins, and secure tail.

- 8) Fold a piece of white paper and roll it small, push into the Manta's body through the mouth. This will keep the body cavity open.
- 9) Now your majestic Manta ray is ready to swim, bend the **Cephalic** and **Pectoral fins** a little. You could hang your finished Manta ray so it can circle freely just like its circling a reef cleaning station.
