

SHARKS OF THE DEEP

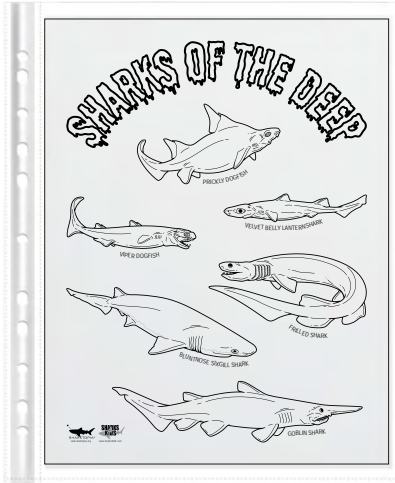
FLASH LIGHT ACTIVITY



MATERIALS NEEDED:

- White paper (for printing the sheet of deep sea sharks and the flashlight)
- One black sheet of paper
- Coloring supplies: colored pencils, crayons, or markers, etc.
- Scissors and glue (or tape) for the flashlight
- Clear sleeve paper protector
- Black permanent marker (for tracing)

INSTRUCTIONS

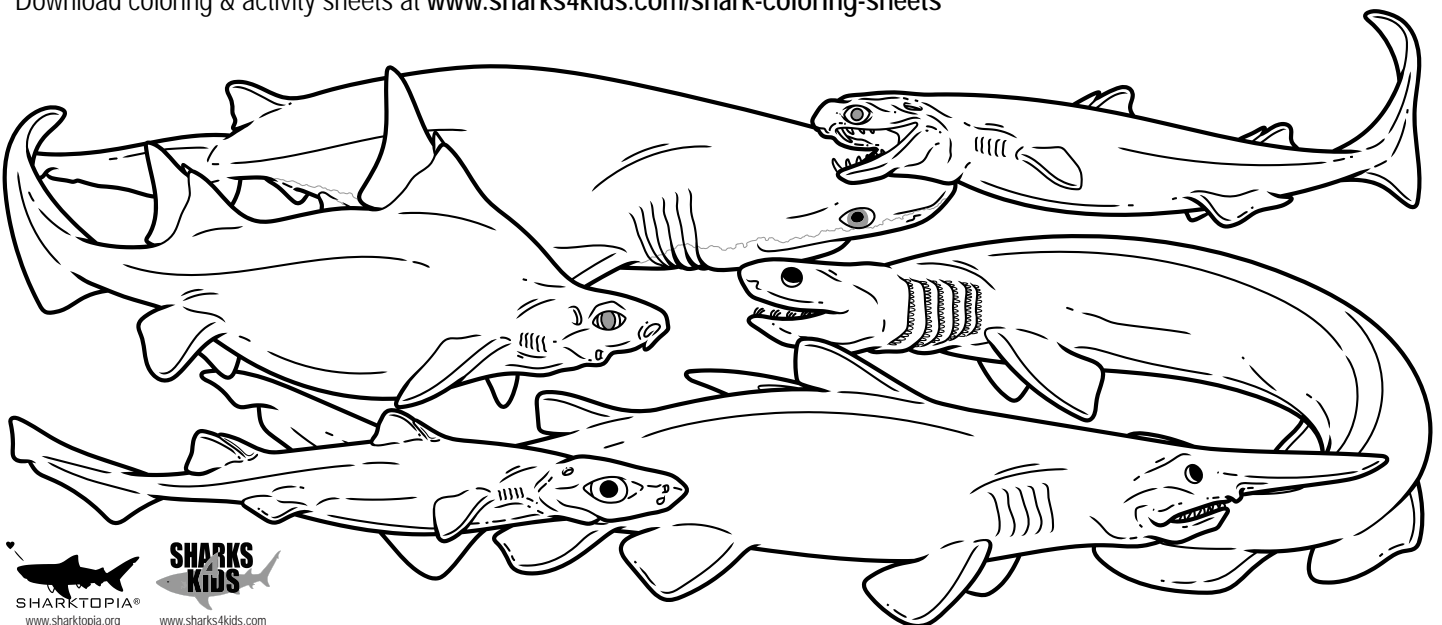


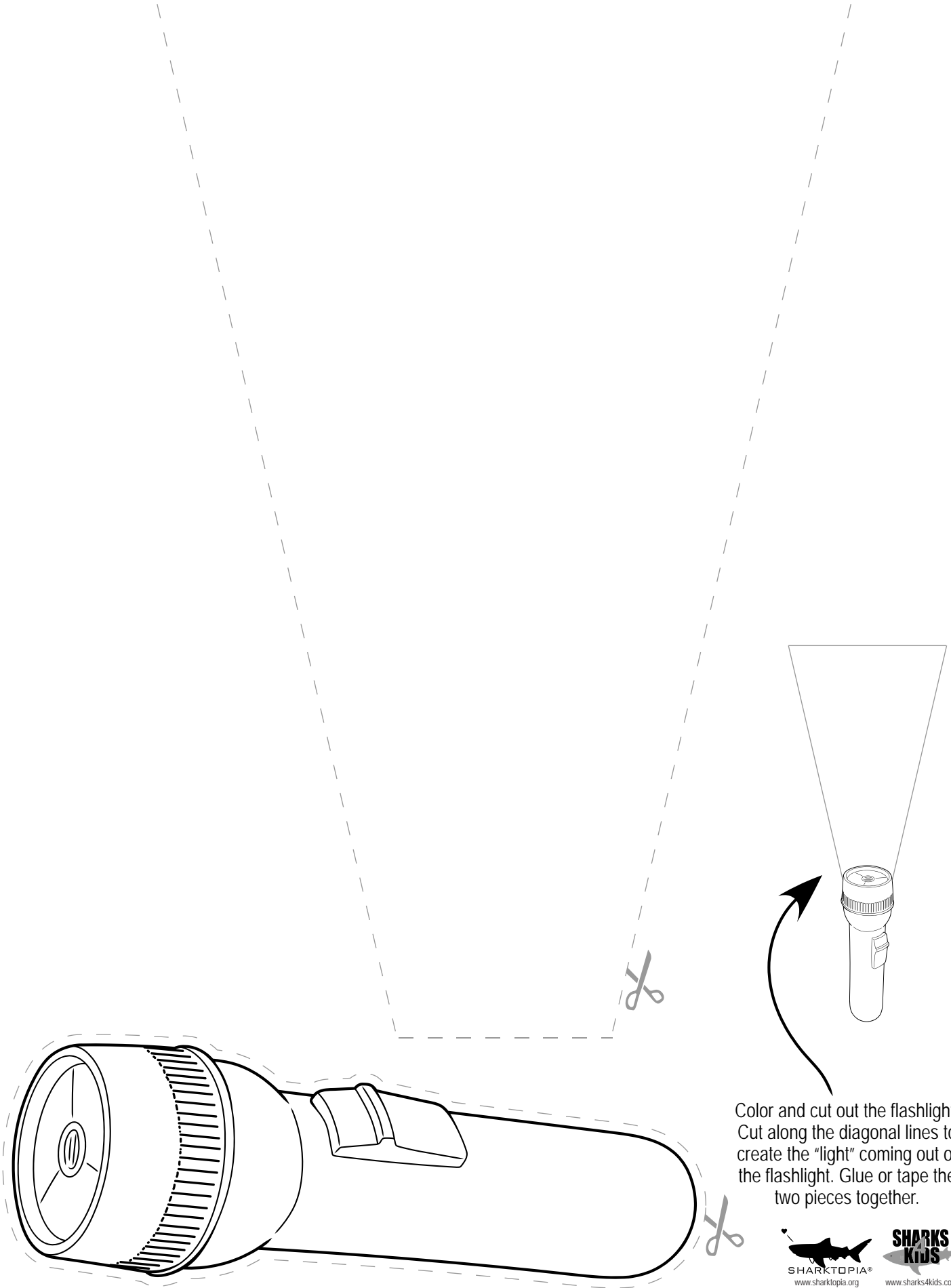
SHARKS: Slide the sheet of deep sea sharks into the clear sleeve paper protector. Use a black permanent marker to trace the sharks onto the clear sleeve. Color the sharks with markers or keep them as outlines (black marker only). To make it more challenging, don't write the species names on the clear sleeve (see bonus option below). When you're done tracing, remove the shark sheet from the clear sleeve. Slide a black sheet of paper into the clear sleeve to hide the sharks.

FLASHLIGHT: Color and cut out the flashlight. Cut along the diagonal lines to create the "light" coming out of the flashlight. Glue or tape the two pieces together. Use the flashlight to reveal the sharks by placing the 'light' between the clear sleeve and the black paper.

BONUS: Download our "Sharks of the Deep" coloring & activity booklet and other deep sea shark coloring sheets to learn about the different species. You can leave the species names off the clear sleeve paper protector and use this activity as a quiz. Learn about each species from the coloring and activity sheets and then name the different shark species as you reveal them with the flashlight.

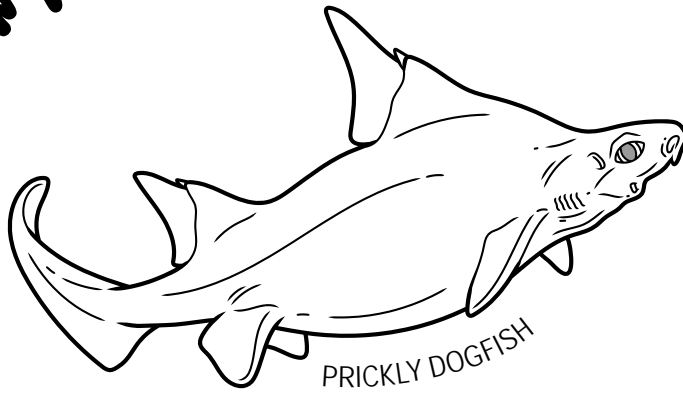

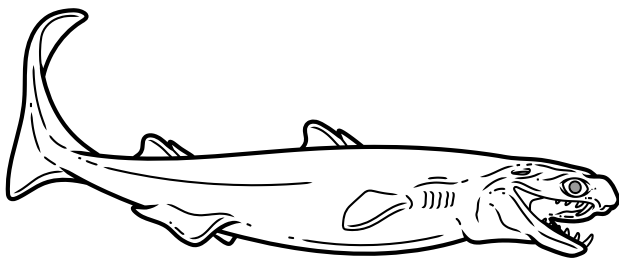


Color and cut out the flashlight. Cut along the diagonal lines to create the "light" coming out of the flashlight. Glue or tape the two pieces together.

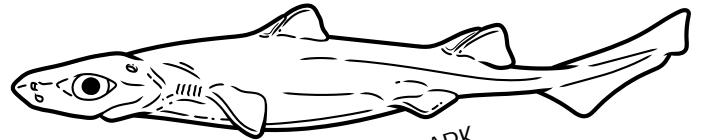

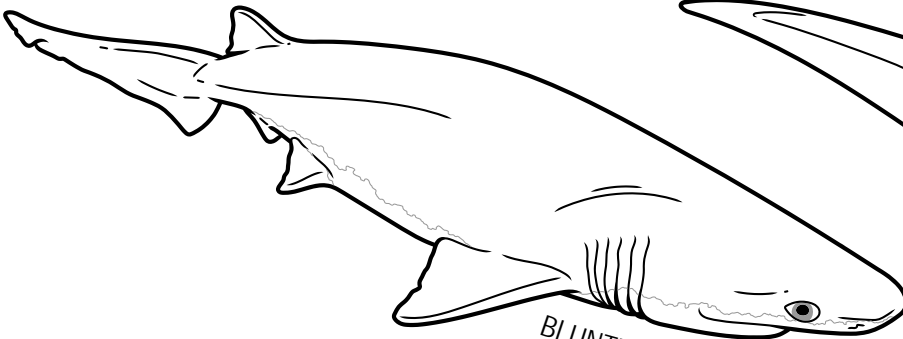
PRICKLY DOGFISH



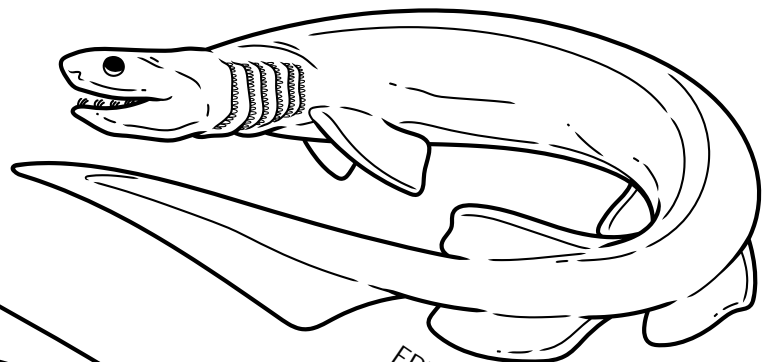
VIPER DOGFISH



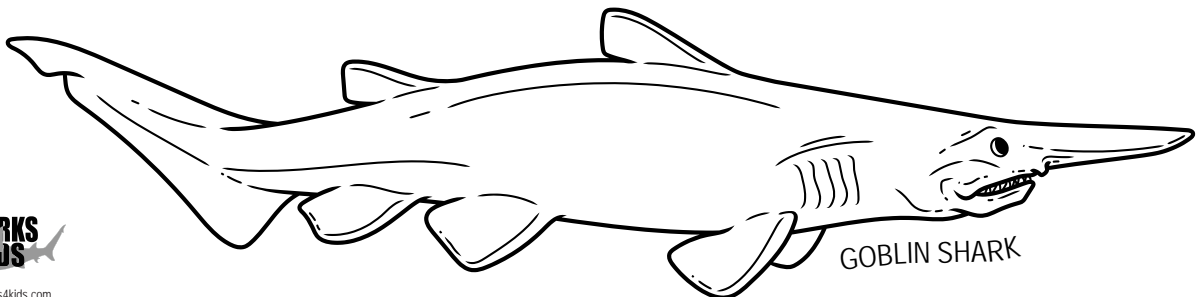
VELVET BELLY LANTERNSHARK
